



Prevent Infection

Germs Don't Take Sick Days!

An increase of cleaning frequencies is recommended for the foreseeable future, especially for general disinfection.



Coverage & Containment
Covering of garbage bins and clearing them daily to prevent spillage.



Toilets Regular cleaning of toilets with extra attention to high touch points like seats, water taps & grab poles.



Prevention
Reminding staff to engage in daily prevention practices such as hand washing and proper food hygiene.

Dwell times for disinfectants to work



Disinfectants
A disinfectants "contact time" refers to how long a product needs to sit and remain wet for it to kill the germs it is meant to kill.



Products
Some products might need to be applied through spraying or need to be diluted a certain amount or mixed a certain way.



Contact Time
It is always pertinent to follow the suggested contact time of any product you or your cleaning staff uses.
